
Territories in Latin America

Much of U.S. foreign policy in the early 1900s focused on protecting the nation's interests in Latin America. To enforce its policies, the United States often attacked or occupied different areas in this region. Then in 1916 and 1917, General John Pershing led an expedition to capture Mexican rebels who opposed the United States.
